

In The Son the action takes place on a dark night in a deserted village. An elderly couple is looking out of the window discussing the lack of activity outside. The drunken

neighbour is expected home from a night out, and the couple is keeping an eye on the bus stop through the window. When the neighbour finally arrives, he is, surprisingly enough, accompanied by the couple's son who they have not heard from in a long time. The unexpected encounter between the mother, the father and the son together with the neighbour's argumentative intervention, have major impact on the family.

The International Ibsen Scholarships

The International Ibsen Scholarships were initiated by the Norwegian government i 2007 and amount to NOK 1.000.000 NOK (approx. 125.000 Euro/150.000 US Dollars).

The scholarships are meant to act as incentives for critical discourse in regards to existential and society-related subject matters concerning Henrik Ibsen. Previous years, projects from Asia, North-America, Europe, Africa and Australia have received scholarships.

The Norwegian Ibsen Award

The Norwegian Ibsen Award is Norway's only award for contemporary playwrights. The award was established in 1986 in Skien, the town of Henrik Ibsen's birth, for the advancement of new Norwegian drama. The award winner receives NOK 150.000,- and a statuette by the sculptor Nina Sundbye.

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
